Originally I am an experimental plasma physicist. I wrote my thesis in 1982 on the experimental work on radiative cooling of the divertor and helium exhaust done in Doublet-III. I worked in many tokamaks: JFT-2, Doublet-III, TFTR, PBX, DIII-D and JT-60U. I was also involved in the physics design of present ITER and led the project of publishing the Progress in ITER Physics

Basis (2007). From now on in Rokkasho I would like to make as much contribution as I can to DEMO and its R&D both with the administrative and technical aspects.

I am living in Misawa with my family (my wife and my son). I speak Japanese, English and some French. I read some German, too. My hobby is listening to and singing classical music. In Provence I sang songs of Fauré, Schubert, Schumann and other composers with the piano accompaniment of my friends. I was a member of Association des Musiciens Amateurs de Haute Provence (Association of Amateur Musicians of Haute Provence) and participated in their concerts held a few times a year.
